
DhulHijjah



Dhulhijjah

(one of His 4 Sacred Months)

- Dhulhijjah ذُو ٱلْحِجَّة means "Possessor of the Pilgrimage" or "The Month of the Pilgrimage".
- It is the twelfth and final month in the Islamic calendar, and it is one of the four sacred months in Islam. (The other sacred months being Dhulkaedah, Muharram and Rejab)
- Dhulhijjah is also the month in which the *Hajj*, or pilgrimage takes place. This act of worship is **one of the Five Pillars of Islam** and is a sacred event in Islam.
- The Hajj is performed on the **eighth**, **ninth** and the tenth of Dhulhijjah with Day of Arafah taking place on the ninth. Eid al-Adha, or the "Festival of the Sacrifice", begins on the tenth day and ends on sunset of the 13th.

"Indeed, the number of months ordained by Allah is twelve—in Allah's Record since the day He created the heavens and the earth—of which four are sacred. That is the Right Way. So do not wrong yourselves during these months. And together fight the polytheists as they fight against you together. And know that Allah is with those mindful (of Him)."

(Surah At-Tawbah, 9:36)



If we can look forward to birthdays, anniversaries and special occasions and take special note of these months, then shouldn't we also give special attention to a month Allah SWT has mentioned in the Quran as sacred?

Allah SWT also mentioned in the same Ayah that we shouldn't wrong ourselves during these months – so what are some of the bad habits we can strive to stop doing these months?



8th Dhulhijjah

On the first day of Hajj, Pllgrims peform their very first rite of Hajj by entering into a state of *Ihram*. They will head to Mina where they will spend the night.

10th Dhulhijjah

Adha. Pilgrims head to Mina to perform the first stone-throwing of 7 pebbles at the largest of three columns known as Jamarat. This act symbolises the stoning of the devil.



9th Dhulhijjah

Pilgrims gather in Arafah from before noon until sunset to take their stand (wuquf) of faith before God, and spend their time in reverent prayer.

After sunset, pilgrims head to *Mudzalifah* to collect pebbles for the next day's rite and where they will spend the night under the sky and stars.

11th & 12th Dhulhijjah

Pilgrims will return to
Jamarat bridge to throw
7 pebbles at each of the
three pillars on each day.
When they are done, they
will return to Makkah to
perform their farewell
Tawaf.






- Over 100,000 in number accompanied Rasulullah in this Hajj, and the companion Jabir RA said: "I could see people as far as my eyes could see."
- Many believers who were not from Mecca or Medina jumped at the opportunity to meet Rasulullah for the first time!
- Rasulullah gave his final khutbah /sermon on the Mount of Arafah, on the 9th of Dhulhijjah around Asr time.
- Rasulullah sis's final address covered every aspect of life and it addressed every human rights issue that is still relevant today.

Let's now imagine we are all on the plains of Arafah, in our state of Ihram, full of gratitude and awe for being able to perform our Hajj, and listening to Rasulullah sisk khutbah. Imagine being addressed by the one who has prayed and cried for you in the depths of the nights, who was most concerned about you, more than you are for yourself, and who loves you sisk. Once your heart is ready, let's proceed to read the final address of our beloved Prophet sisk!





O people, **hear me well**: I explain to you. For I do not know; I may well not meet you again in this place where I now stand, after this year of mine.

O people: your lives and your property, until the very day you meet your Lord, are as inviolable to each other as the inviolability of this day you are now in, and the month you are now in. Have I given the message?—O Allah, be my witness. So let whoever has been given something for safekeeping give it back to him who gave him it.

Truly, the usury of the Era of Ignorance has been laid aside forever, Your capital, however is yours to keep. You will neither inflict nor suffer any inequity. **Allah has judged that there shall be no usury** and the first usury I begin with is that which is due to my father's brother 'Abbas ibn 'Abd al-Muttalib.

And truly the blood-vengeance of the Era of Ignorance has been laid aside forever, and the first blood-vengeance we shall start with is that which is due for the blood of [my kinsman] 'Amir ibn Rabi'a ibn Harith ibn 'Abd al-Muttalib.

Truly, the hereditary distinctions that were pretensions to respect in the Era of Ignorance have been laid aside forever, except for the custodianship of the Kaaba [by Bani 'Abd al-Dar] and the giving of drink to pilgrims by al-'Abbas. A deliberate murder is subject to retaliation in kind. An accidental death from a deliberate injury means a death resulting from [something not usually used or intended as a deadly weapon such as] a stick or a rock, for which the indemnity is one hundred camels: whoever asks for more is a person of the Era of Ignorance.

O people: the Devil has despaired of ever being worshipped in this land of yours, though he is content to be obeyed in other works of yours, that you deem to be of little importance.

O people: postponing the inviolability of a sacred month [claiming to postpone the prohibition of killing in it to a subsequent month, so as to continue warring despite the sacred month's having arrived] is a surfeit of unbelief, by which those who disbelieve are led astray, making it lawful one year and unlawful in another, in order to match the number [of months] Allah has made inviolable. Time has verily come full turn, to how it was the day Allah created the heavens and the earth. Four months there are which are inviolable, three in a row and forth by itself: Dhul Qa'da, Dhul Hijja, and Muharram; and Rajab, which lies between Jumada and Sha'ban. Have I given the message?— O Allah, be my witness.

O people: verily you owe your women their rights, and they owe you yours. They may not lay with another men in your beds, let anyone into your houses you do not want without your permission, or commit indecency. If they do, Allah has given you leave to debar them, send them from your beds, or [finally] strike them in a way that does no harm. But if they desist, and obey you, then you must provide for them and clothe them fittingly.

The women who live with you are like captives, unable to manage for themselves: you took them as a trust from Allah, and enjoyed their sex as lawful through a word legal ruling from Allah. So fear Allah in respect to women, and concern yourselves with their welfare. Have I given the message?—O Allah, be my witness.

O people, believers are but brothers. **No one may** take his brother's property without his full consent. Have I given the message? —O Allah, be my witness.

O people, your Lord is One, and your father is one: all of you are from Adam, and Adam was from the ground. The noblest of you in Allah's sight is the most God-fearing; Arab has no merit over non-Arab other than piety. Have I given the message?—O Allah, be my witness. —At this, they said yes. He said: Then let whoever is present tell whoever is absent.



O people, Allah has apportioned to every deserving heir his share of the estate, and no deserving heir may accept a special bequest, and no special bequest may exceed a third of the estate.

A child's lineage is that of the [husband who owns the] bed, and adulterers shall be stoned. Whoever claims to be the son of someone besides his father or a bondsman who claims to belong to other than his masters shall bear the curse of Allah and the angels and all men: no deflecting of it or ransom for it shall be accepted from him.

"Today I have perfected for you your religion, and completed My blessing upon you, and approved for you Islam as religion" (Al-Maidah, 5:3)

When the Prophet ended the Farewell Sermon, Bilal RA started to call the adhan for the noon prayer. The Messenger of God led the noon prayer for that magnificent congregation. He later led the afternoon prayer, thus combining the prayers of two different times with one adhan and two iqamas.

Increasing in acts of worship, especially in the first 10 days of this month as these are the best days of the year. We'll give you examples in a bit!



Fasting on the Day of Arafah as it "expiates the sins of the past year and the coming year." (Muslim)



Having an early morning and performing Eid prayers is a sunnah of the Prophet (ﷺ).




Takbir from after Fajr on the Day of 'Arafah (9th Zulhijjah) until Asar of the last day of Tashriq (13th Zulhijjah)

Narrated Ibn Abbas:

The Prophet said, "No good deeds done on other days are <u>superior</u> to those done on these (first ten days of Dhulhijjah)."

Then some companions of the Prophet said, "Not even Jihad?" He replied, "Not even Jihad, except that of a man who does it by putting himself and his property in danger (for Allah's sake) and does not return with any of those things."

Are we avoiding idle talk / gossip?




other recommended acts of worship:

To Remember, Praise and Glorify Allah, More (Increase in Dhikr)

- "There are no days greater in the sight of Allah and in which righteous deeds are more beloved to Him than these ten days, so during this time recite a great deal of **Tahlil** (La Ilaha Illallah), **Takbir** (Allahu Akbar) and **Tahmid** (Alhamdulillah)."
- Another form of Dhikr that we can repeat is the **Talbiyah**, which is recited by pilgrims frequently throughout their Hajj.

Reciting the Quran

- The Prophet said, "Whoever reads a letter from the Book of Allah, he will have a reward. And that reward will be multiplied by ten. I am not saying that "Alif, Laam, Meem" is a letter, rather I am saying that "Alif" is a letter, "laam" is a letter and "meem" is a letter!". (Tirmidhi)





Repentance & Fasting: A Beautiful Combo on Arafah!

- If Allah SWT has declared that the Day of Arafah is the time He sets free more slaves from Hell than any other day, then this is THE DAY to turn to Allah in repentance and to seek His Forgiveness. No other day will ever come close to this day, Champs!
- Even so, we are encouraged to ask for forgiveness not just on this day, but every single day as the Prophet (May peace be upon him) "turn to Allah in repentance more than 70 times a day". (Bukhari)
- We should also sincerely intent to fast on the Day of Arafah, which is on the 9th of Dhulhijjah as it "expiates for the past and coming years." (Muslim)

Performing the Eid Prayer

- Waking up early is a Sunnah of the Prophet (May peace be upon him) as he has mentioned that, "Allah made the early hours blessed for my Ummah." (Ahmed)
- Going out to Eid prayer early is another Sunnah of the Prophet (May Peace be upon him), as he narrated in a Khutba, "The first thing to be done on this day (first day of EidulAdha) is to pray; and after returning from the prayer we slaughter our sacrifices (in the name of Allah) and whoever does so, he acted according to our Sunna (traditions)." (Bukhari)

Qurbani
(The Sacrifice)





- Qurban or Sacrifice is an act of animalsacrifice that is performed in the first three days of the Eidul Adha (Festival of Sacrifice) as an act of devotion to Allah SWT.
- The animals allowed for Qurban are goat, sheep, cow, buffalo or camel, and the slaughtered meats are generally donated to the poor and needy.
- The act of sacrificing animals symbolises
 our reliance in Allah SWT and our
 willingness to give up things that are
 close to our hearts, in order to gain His
 Pleasure.
- Ultimately, "Neither their meat nor blood reaches Allah. Rather, it is your piety that reaches Him. (Surah Al-Hajj, 22:37)

Bonus: Get to know Prophet Ibrahim AS



Prophet Ibrahim AS is known as Abul Anbiya, or the

Father of Prophets. He is also known as Khalilullah,
intimate friend of Allah - the highest degree of
closeness one can reach with Allah. His life is
pivotal to some rites of worship done during Hajj
including the act of running between Safa &
Marwa, the Stoning at Jamarat, and the Qurbani.
